Welcome To The Mystic's Vision!

The Mystic's Vision website is dedicated to the praise and glory of God and is created solely for your benefit. It is based, not on belief or religious doctrine, but on my own direct mystical experience.

Hello. My name is Swami Abhayananda. It has been my good fortune to experience God in mystical vision, and I wish to share with you that vision in the hope that I might inspire you to know Him in yourself.

Some may think that mystical experience is a kind of delusion, but, though it is rare, it is very real. True mystical experience presents a clear and authentic window into the universal spiritual Reality.

By the Grace of God, Jesus of Nazareth famously experienced his mystical vision on the banks of the Jordan river during his baptism by a holy man named John, and when he told others of the experience, few believed him. Now, twenty centuries later, this mystical experience continues to happen periodically to devout young men, and yet the recipients of this divine Grace are still not believed and are still rejected and ignored by the people.

Wake up, my friends. Spiritual or Mystical experience, the personal revelation of God, is a real thing. It doesn't happen every day. Nor does it happen to everyone. But it *does* happen to a select few.

Mystical experience, or "the mystic's vision," occurs as one's individual consciousness is uplifted by Grace to union with the eternal Source of all consciousness and all being. That vision has

been referred to as "enlightenment," "the vision of God," "samadhi," "nirvana," "Self-realization," "the mystic marriage," or "union with God;" but no matter what it is called, that unitive mystical experience reveals an eternal truth that is one and the same for all, regardless of one's religious affiliation.

In that revelatory mystical experience, an individual directly experiences the Source and substance of his being, and thereby realizes his own eternal identity. This is the experience by which Siddhartha, the Buddha, became enlightened; this is the experience by which the authors of the Upanishads realized their eternal Self; this is the experience by which Jesus came to know his oneness with God; and this is the experience by which al-Hallaj and Rumi and ibn-Arabi came to know *ana'l Haqq*, "I am The Eternal." My friends, that rare God-given realization is the same for all who experience it.

The journey of the soul is a journey over numerous lifetimes to the ultimate realization that you are eternally one with God. It is a journey toward the purification of your heart, and as Jesus has taught us: "Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God." Indeed, God brings his children through their unique life-experiences to the eventual purification of their heart through love, and the reward of that purification is "the vision of God."

Do not imagine that when you experience "the vision of God," God will be seen as something or someone *else* standing before you; No, the vision of God is the divine revelation that you and all creatures, as well as all things that exist, are made of God, reside in God, and are ultimately nothing else but God; it reveals the knowledge that

all this world is indeed 'the kingdom of God,' and that God truly lives within everything and everyone.

"The vision of God" is an opening of your own consciousness to the realization that you and all beings are contained in and consist of the one divine and all-pervasive Consciousness that is God. To experience that awakening is your sole goal and purpose in this journey of many lives. In reaching this goal, you will clearly know the Truth, and the Truth shall make you free.

Your soul will begin its journey when God mercifully awakens His love in your heart. That love is His own and has the power to draw your heart to Him, despite all other attractions. Give Him the one-pointed devotion of your heart and follow wherever He leads. O my friends, do not pass by such good fortune as this! He is in your heart, for He has fashioned you as His own image. Acknowledge His presence and follow His guidance, and He will lead you to your perfect joy in Him.

The unitive mystical vision experienced by the enlightened radically challenges the way one ordinarily sees the world, for in that vision all is seen as divine, all is seen to be the one eternal Consciousness appearing as the various objects of the world. One who has experienced that vision and has known his or her transcendent Identity as the one all-pervading Spirit is said to be a mystic. By that vision, he or she is enlightened, knowing with certainty that all beings are but waves on the ocean of God, immersed in God, united with God, and made entirely of God.

Believe it or not, my friends, there really is such a thing as enlightenment—a sudden revelation of your own divinity and the divinity of all reality. I know, because it happened to me. And that divine experience has overwhelmingly transformed my life. Now, I can't tell you how *you* can attain spiritual enlightenment; that is in the hands of God! I can only tell you how *I* did and what was

revealed to me.

My mystical experience occurred in 1966, when I was twenty-eight years of age. I had been drawn to a remote cabin in the Santa Cruz mountains of California by my desire to know God. Prior to that time, I was an ordinary fellow who knew nothing of mysticism or mystical experience; but it was there in that remote cabin in the woods on one November night that God blessed me with His revealing vision and changed my life forever.

On that night, I prayed to our Father that He let me be one with Him—not that I might glory in His love—but that I might speak out in His praise and to His glory for the benefit of all His children. And, in that instant, He revealed to my inner eye that even I am in Him and belong to Him. The first words out of my mouth were, "O my God, even this body is Thine own!" He made me to see with *His* eye that everyone and everything exists in Him, is enveloped in Him, and consists of His own being. Since that time, I have endeavored to fulfill my promise to Him by speaking out in His praise and to His glory, solely for your benefit. By His Grace, I have seen the everlasting truth, and my only task in this life is to share that truth with you.

I shared that experience in my first book, *THE SUPREME SELF*, published in 1984. This book may be read in its entirety or downloaded free at the READ OR DOWNLOAD BOOKS page. In this vision, the narrow consciousness of the individual becomes suddenly transformed into the all-inclusive consciousness of God. Then the duality of 'I' and 'Thou' vanishes like a dream, and what remains is an 'I' that knows no 'other'—an 'I' that is an eternal and limitless

awareness, filling all. That 'I' is the one Mind, the original Consciousness, the sole Creator and Self of all selves.

Does everyone know about this vision? I don't think so. And yet this awakening, this transformation, keeps happening to a few young men and women throughout the duration of time— It happened to the authors of the Upanishads; it happened to the Buddha, and it happened to Jesus, Plotinus, al-Hallaj and Meister Eckhart, and many others. It also happened to me in this present era, revealing the Truth to my inward eye. And yet so few are even aware of the occurrence in our midst of this strange transformative phenomenon!

Does the Lord wish to keep it a secret, or does He wish to gradually let everyone know about it in His time? I don't know! Many of those who have experienced this inner vision have spoken of it as best they were able, and yet, despite the many voices that have told of it, its occurrence remains largely unknown among the people.

No one seems to know how to bring about this rare vision, except by drawing near to God in highborn contemplative thought or prayer. It is agreed by everyone that it occurs only to those whom He chooses to reveal Himself; that it is His doing and His alone. Still, we must pursue it, for there is no other treasure so worth pursuing. It is an inestimable blessing that makes a wise person of a fool, a joyful person of a wretch; and turns an ordinary person into a king.

Therefore, seek Him out in the depths of your heart. Call to Him in the lonely darkness of your nights. Shine the searchlight of your desire into the hidden corners of His fathomless Being and beg Him in song and in prayer to shed His mercy on your otherwise inconsolable soul.

from PRAISING GOD

Hardly anyone believes in the existence of the tyrannical God that the ancient Greeks invented and called Zeus, nor does hardly anyone believe in the existence of the tyrannical God the Jews invented and called Jahveh. Those who have actually experienced God within themselves have told us that the Divinity underlying all Reality is a universal Mind--a Spirit that lives as the Consciousness of every sentient being. That Spirit is also the Creator of all forms: It periodically radiates from Itself a Light that easily transmutes into various forms, constituting all the individual beings and objects that fill the universe.

That Divine Spirit is very different from what we used to think of as "a god." It is not a being among beings but is rather the sole Existence that contains everything that exists. It is ubiquitous Consciousness, but It also has the Power to create innumerable worlds with Its expanding form-producing Light. It is therefore in every instance both the background and the foreground, both the absolute Existence and the divine Creative Energy, both the Soul and the body.

We are naturally reluctant to call this dual-faceted Spirit "a god" since It does not fit the old mold created by the Greeks or the Jews. But, since It is a unique and all-inclusive category unto Itself, we may call It whatever we like. We may call It "God," we may call It "Brahman," we may call It "Allah," we may call It "the Void," we may call It "the One," or we may call It "our Father." In fact, every imaginable word ultimately signifies that Divine Presence, as everything is contained in and constituted of It.

Just remember that He is within you, as the ocean is in the wave;

that you are within Him, as the wave is within the ocean; and that you and the Father are one, just as the wave and the ocean are one. Our God is very wonderful. He is the very epitome of Good. He fulfills the desires and inner longings of every soul, and just as a loving Father leads his children home, He leads us to our blissful rest in Him. When souls come to know Him in themselves, their love awakes, and their happiness knows no bounds. And then they sing His praise and experience His joy in their hearts. This is His wondrous gift for which we lift our voices in song to praise our God, our Father, the One who is alone the summit of all sweetness and joy!

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WHO DO YOU THINK YOU ARE?

Oh, you don't believe in God, huh? So where do you think you are?

In some accidental material universe? This universal matter is but an immense congregation of electromagnetic signals! You're in God's light show, genius!

MYSTICAL EXPERIENCE AND THE POPULAR CULTURE

Mystical experience is the bedrock source of all wisdom. It is the source of the Upanishads; it is the source of Buddhism; it is the source of the teachings of Abraham and Moses; it is the source of the teachings of Jesus; and it is the source of the teachings of Muhammed in the Quran. Why is it then that there is so little public acknowledgement of the existence of mystical experience and its importance in the lives of the great representatives of human spirituality?

Mystical experience has occurred throughout our history to a few extraordinary individuals, who having told of their divine revelations, have deeply affected the course of human religious tradition and the history of human development; and yet our popular societal culture is quite oblivious to the occurrence of mystical experience.

The "news media" may be relied upon to feature daily the latest rap star or movie queen, but when was the last time you heard or saw in the News any mention of mystical experience and its profound implications for an increase in understanding of our true nature and the true nature of our world? Is it possible that we are just in a cultural slump these days? No. It is *not* just the commentators of today; it has always been thus. Reporters of the secular culture have always been deaf and blind to accounts of anything beyond their sensory experience. It is only the mystics themselves who speak of mystical experience; the subject remains utterly closed to the ignorant majority of people in our popular societal culture.

Frustrating as it is, the layered inequality of spiritual understanding among people seems to be an *intended* feature of the Creator's universal scheme of things, and therefore the mystic's vision will continue to remain an inconceivable mystery to all but those blessed few who are privileged to experience it. Only those who are known as "mystics" are able to speak authoritatively about mystical experience, its source, and its content. To all others, it is an unfathomable mystery whose existence is subject to belief or disbelief in accordance with each individual's personal inclination.

On the positive side, however, the academic community is very much engaged recently in discussing 'mystical experience'. Since William James' *Varieties of Religious Experience*, we have seen a rash of learned academic articles regarding the validity or non-validity of mystical experience by academic professors whose only familiarity with such experience is from what they have read in books. But however beneficial this may be to the general awareness of mystical experience in our society, I would like to point out to these earnest scholars that one of the distinguishing hallmarks of mystical experience is that such an experience, being a divine revelation, occurs beyond the level of normal human consciousness, and is therefore quite beyond any kind of normal psychological evaluation or explication.

For that reason, if an admittedly ineffable mystical experience is to be spoken of, it may be done effectively only by one who has actually experienced it. It is only fitting that what we learn of mystical experience we learn from those who claim to have experienced it. Those who are tempted to offer their learned opinion on mystical vision, without any direct experience of it, must be kindly advised to remain silent.

In one's normal, everyday state of consciousness, it is admittedly possible to conceive some ideas about the nature of God and His creation, but it is not possible to actually *see* the spiritual nature of things; for that, you must enter into the divine consciousness. You must be drawn by the grace of God into an altered state of rapturous awareness, in which the divine glory is made visible and where all things and all beings are clearly realized to live in the kingdom of God. This is realized in an abnormally heightened state of awareness. I would not call it a trance, but it is definitely other than one's ordinary state of consciousness; it is more concentrated, more focused, more awake, and only in that extraordinary realm of awareness will you be able to see your true nature as divine, as all-pervading. Unfortunately, however, there are no roads leading to this clarified state of consciousness and no directions for how to find it; it is a place to which only God can take you.

When I was a young man, Almighty God, who fills the universe and commands the elements, who is the Lord and Ruler of all that is, placed in my heart a prayer; and then He fulfilled that prayer by making me one with Himself, filling me with divine knowledge and grace. Is this not a moment to celebrate as one of the very greatest moments in all of human history? To me, of course it is. And, when the Lord casts His gaze upon you and enlightens *your* heart with His divine favor, the greatest moment in human history will occur for *you*. Until then, continue to seek Him with all your heart and soul.

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An Unfamiliar Truth

It has been repeatedly shown throughout history that the common people will believe whatever the religious and political authorities want them to believe, even if it is untrue. It should not be so difficult, then, to believe that the story told by the early century Church authorities of the impregnation by God of a Palestinian woman who then gave birth to Jesus of Nazareth was also untrue. And, although it has become clear that there are no recordable instances of God ever having behaved in that manner, popular belief in the story has persisted simply out of habit and respect for a long-held cultural tradition.

For twenty-one centuries, we in the Western world have been fed a load of crap by the established religious institutions. The early Christian zealots claimed that Jesus was the sole and unique progeny of God Almighty, the very incarnation of God, and therefore an object of devotion. And it was these Christian zealots who originated the religious organization whose purpose was to establish and support widespread belief in that very doctrine—the doctrine of Jesus' unique divinity.

The simple truth of the matter, however, is much more amazing and wonderful: As Jesus himself has told us, not only is *he* divine, but *all of us* are divine! God manifests Himself in and as every human being, and when that human being becomes spiritually evolved to the extent that he or she can experience the intuitive awareness that they are in fact a manifestation of God, then, by the Grace of God, they awake to their divine Identity. This is the experience that awakened Jesus on that fateful day on the banks of the Jordan river. It is an experience that many others have also experienced, and you too can experience that great awakening.

Jesus was a normal young Jewish Palestinian who, because of his devotion to God and God's merciful Grace, experienced a profound revelation during a spiritual baptism on the banks of the Jordan river. That divine revelation enabled Jesus to *see* into his own nature, to *know* that he was in fact the one universal Spirit, that he and all creatures are truly the projected manifestations of God.

During the lifetime of Jesus, such an enlightening experience was wholly unheard of among the public and was therefore misunderstood by many of those to whom Jesus spoke of it. Because of this misunderstanding, Jesus was murdered by an ignorant mob of outraged citizens. But Jesus' teachings had also inspired a number of earnest followers, and for his followers, Jesus' vision had only one explanation: that Jesus had experienced his oneness with God because he was a uniquely divine being, a being who was to be exalted and worshipped as God Himself.

Today, that assumption has become a worldwide myth that many regard as sacrosanct truth, a myth that has become established in the minds of the people for over twenty-one centuries. However, over the centuries, other young men in other parts of the world have experienced the same revelation that Jesus experienced, and therefore the myth of Jesus' unique status has been steadily eroding.

Today, it is understood that a number of devout young men of differing nationalities, who have lived at various times throughout history, have also experienced such a spiritual or 'mystical' vision, and have testified to the content of this experience. According to these many 'mystics,' it is a 'unitive' experience, given by God, in

which the individualized soul no longer experiences its limited soul-identity, but experiences its greater Self, its Source and Origin, the Father of the universe, and knows its own eternal Identity. It knows, as Jesus had known, 'I am in the Father, and the Father is in me. I and the Father are one.'

To experience the Divine revelation, in which it is revealed to you inwardly in your soul that you are a manifestation of God, and identical with Him—identical with the supreme Existence—is a very remarkable thing! To experience this is to experience what was revealed to Jesus, what was revealed to Meister Eckhart, what was revealed to Rumi and Ibn Arabi, what was revealed many long years ago to Lao Tze, Heraclitus, Socrates and other favored souls throughout time.

It is in fact only a relative few who have experienced this revelation, and today few have even heard of its occurrence, even though each of these aforementioned individuals attempted with all their heart and all their strength to tell of it to all those living at the time. I too have made a great effort to tell of this experience to all who would listen, but very few have the ability to even hear and comprehend information regarding the spiritual Reality. If you haven't known God, you cannot understand how wonderful, how extraordinarily wonderful, such an experience really is. And you are not to blame for this lack of understanding, for only those who have been graced by His revealed presence can know what it is. The question of why that experience is limited to so few, however, is a mystery that I cannot explain.

Just know that the story of Jesus is true, though it has been misinterpreted over the years. Some authors of the Upanishads have also known God, as has Plotinus, Philo Judaeus, Meister

Eckhart, Ibn Arabi, Jalaluddin Rumi, and many others. I am happy to say that I am also to be counted among these fortunate souls.

I have been writing about my unitive mystical experience for many years now, and I have long known that the larger populace regards my testament of mystical experience as either a hallucination or a fraudulent representation and considers me to be either a liar, a deceiver, a con artist or simply a pitiably deluded fool. I don't think that this universal judgement is due to any fault or inability of my own, but rather because it's just so difficult to know and trust what a person has to say when that person says that they have come to know God directly and intimately. To those unfamiliar with mystical experience, it sounds very much like the preaching of ordinary zealots whose only basis for their knowledge is what they learned from a "holy" book, and it may seem to be a dangerous precedent to acknowledge its occurrence.

It is true that this public judgement is helpless to affect or harm me, but this judgement greatly hinders my ability to have a beneficial effect on others through my writing, and I have been unable to understand what I must do to counter this unwarranted public judgement. No doubt, Jesus was also unable to counter it, as were many other mystics throughout history.

Though I have long undertaken to tell you about my mystical experience, I have discovered that, in these current times, almost everyone believes that God and the experience of enlightenment is a myth; it seems that no one is aware of the fact that 'enlightenment,' the experience of union with God, is even something that is possible. And so, I am up against the opinion held by nearly the entire population that I am either dishonest or deluded or both.

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It seems that it is also futile for me to bring up the similar experience of Jesus of Nazareth, since his experience is also believed by many to have been merely a myth. To speak of the other mystics who've existed throughout history and who have written of their experience of God is also a pointless exercise, since no one seems to be aware of their existence either.

Make no mistake, if it were not for the gracious gift of knowledge that God bestowed on me, I would be just as ignorant as you. This is what I must continually remind myself of whenever I am angry and frustrated with you people and your violent culture. I am free of your ignorance and your pain solely by the grace of God, and I am offering you that same knowledge and that same blissful freedom--if you will only take it. I fear for you, my brothers and sisters. I'm afraid that your deliberate ignorance and your unwillingness to learn will bring calamity upon many.

According to the *Gospel of Thomas*, it was over two thousand years ago, near the end of his life, that Jesus uttered these words:

"I took my place in the midst of the world, and I went among the people. I found all of them intoxicated [with pride and ignorance]; I found none of them thirsty [for Truth]. And my soul became sorrowful for the sons of men, because they are blind in their hearts and do not have vision." 2

And now, sadly, in the year 2021, I too must say:

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THE NEO-COPERNICAN REVOLUTION

We are all familiar with the story of Copernicus and his revolutionary sixteenth century theory of a heliocentric solar system. Prior to the publication of his *De revolutionibus orbium coelestium (On the Revolutions of the Celestial Spheres)* in 1543, everyone living in the world believed in the geocentric astronomical theory, that all the planetary bodies seen in the sky revolved, not around the Sun, but around the earth.

When Copernicus showed astronomical evidence that all the planets, including the earth, actually revolve around the Sun, few were able to believe it. Centuries of religiously based tradition were not easily overturned, and people were bitterly reluctant to give up their habitual beliefs. In fact, the heliocentric system became accepted only after the passage of many years, not because thousands of people read Copernicus' work, but because the new vision of the solar system became acknowledged as valid

throughout the scientific community and then eventually filtered down as established fact to the lay religious populace.

Today, the people of the world are in an historical period similar to that which preceded the Copernican revolution, insofar as the people of all the many nations hold fast to their long-held belief in their own regional religious traditions in which one or another historical person is considered to be an icon and personification of that religious tradition, represented as a divine prophet, messenger or progeny of God. But I believe that we are in the latter stages of that prolonged historical period in which the people strongly believe in their multiple regionally based religious mythologies. What is needed now is *a revolution in thought* similar to the scientific revolution that followed the revelations of Copernicus, but this time *a spiritual revolution* that would establish a universally accurate empirical theory embracing and applying to *every* religious tradition, just as Copernicus' heliocentric theory included and applied to every planet.

Enter the evidence of the seers, the mystics—men and women of every spiritual or religious tradition throughout the centuries—who report having experienced a common subjective phenomenon which they describe as "a union of the soul with God." The empirical evidence, accumulated over more than thirty centuries, clearly shows that, not only those who are religious icons, but many ordinary people also, have purportedly experienced intimate contact with their ultimate Source and have told of that experience in various degrees of detail. In nearly every instance of such 'mystical' experience or vision, several common features are noted:

(**One**): Mystical experience reveals to the one experiencing it that the universal Reality is a single integrated Mind-born continuum of Consciousness in which all beings exist, and whose identity is both eternal (as the One Mind) and transient (as the phenomenal universe containing individual objects and individual embodied

souls). The fact that all individual souls are contained in and consist of that all-inclusive continuum of Consciousness ensures the consciousness of each individual soul and its interconnection to the entire continuum as well as to its Source. Each individual soul is therefore as capable as any other of becoming purified and being graciously uplifted to an experience of union with the Divine Source (referred to by Jesus as "the Father").

(**Two**): That unitive experience, which is divinely initiated and facilitated, is a transient one, but while that experience lasts, the individual soul experiencing that "union" is absorbed in and made "one with" the One Mind, knowing itself no longer as an individual soul, but as the One Mind in whom all is contained. It is reported that in that experience of "union," the duality of "I" and "Thou," of soul and Father, no longer exists, and the experiencer perceives and knows 'I am in the Father and the Father is in me. I and the Father are one.'

(**Three**): Also, in that experience of "union" or "unity," the dualities such as 'life' and 'death,' 'time' and 'space,' 'mind' and 'body,' no longer exist; nor do the dualities normally framed in the individual human mind, such as 'good' and 'evil,' 'love' and 'hatred,' 'beautiful' and 'ugly,' 'happy' and 'sad,' etc. These dualities are merely conceptual or emotional and are exclusive to the individual ego/mind in which they exist. With the vanishing of the ego (the sense of an individual 'I'), those opposites are gone; the eternal One is alone and is experienced as one's only Self.

The fact that over the centuries multiple individuals have experienced this mystical "union" with their eternal Source strongly suggests that the early stories portraying those who experienced that "union" as divinely appointed 'saviors,' 'messengers,' or 'messiahs' are simply examples of the zealous misinterpretation of the unitive mystical experiences that occurred in various individuals in the past. Such misinterpretations commonly occur in societies of

people who are ignorant of the perennial occurrence of the unitive spiritual experience—societies such as those existing in the time of Jesus (See footnote 1) or al-Hallaj, or today, for example.

If, in accordance with God's will, such a modern Copernicus was to appear and provide the explanation to the people that the region's favorite prophet, messenger, or progeny of God was in fact simply someone who had a profound mystical experience, momentarily experiencing his oneness with God, and that such mystical experiences are a regular feature of God's activity in rewarding pure souls, might not such an explanation provide a meaningful alternative to the diverse religious narratives existing today?

Such a hypothetical Copernicus might well support his narrative with the overwhelming experiential evidence provided by the recorded testimonials of the mystics. He might even issue a *History of Mysticism* (See footnote 2) to show the recurrence throughout the ages of mystical experience along with the unanimous testimonials of the many mystics of all religious traditions. In this way, he could formulate a convincing historical narrative and initiate a basis for a lasting revolution in the spiritual understanding of all the peoples of the earth.

It would also be helpful if that modern Copernicus were himself a mystic (See footnote 3). That way he would have personal experiential knowledge of his subject, and he would thereby possess the requisite understanding and passion of certainty required to convince the public of the truth of his observations. A universal revolution in spiritual understanding would not develop immediately, however. As in the case of the 16th century revolution, it would require an initial cadre of credible advocates, and, even so, the revolution would likely spread only slowly at first.

But, in time, as the old die-hard partisans of multiple regional religious traditions eventually died off, the many well-known occurrences of mystical experience throughout the ages would become acknowledged, and the universal capability of all people to experience such mystical vision would gradually become universally accepted (See footnote 4). We may even dare to hope that, with the elimination of multiple false religious traditions, bigotry as we now know it would disappear from this world, and all people would at last come to know the joy of the Eternal in their own lives.

And that, of course, is the Divine objective to be attained. Mystical experience shows to the recipient the truth that we all exist in God, that we are all evolving within God, and that our very own nature is God. God is infinite Existence, Consciousness, Freedom and Bliss; and to know Him as our eternal Self is to partake of that nature and to share in His gifts. To *know* God is to know a security, contentment, imperturbability, intelligence and serenity that you never dreamed was possible for you. Having known God as your own divine Self, you will urgently wish that divine happiness for everyone, and you will sing His name ever in your heart.
